The crowd was extremely enthusiastic and I had an opportunity to thank the KICY Volunteer staff, the people who volunteer from the community and our advertising sponsors.

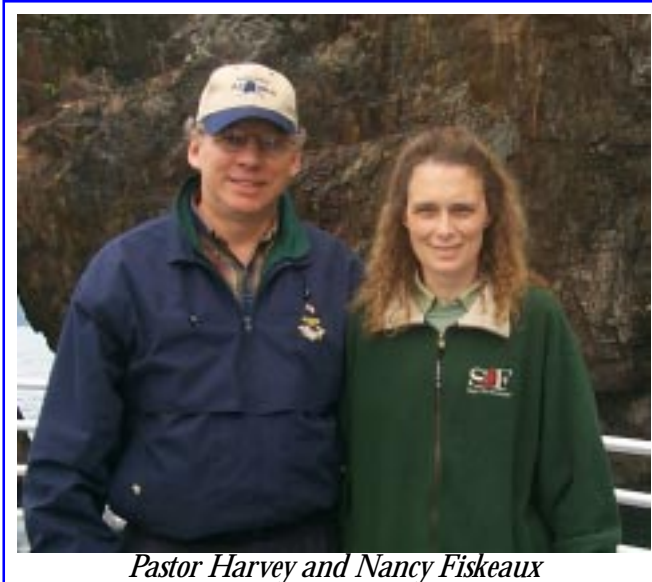
Live broadcasts of any sporting event require a great deal of personal sacrifice. KICY is proud to be able to provide coverage of this calibre to our region.

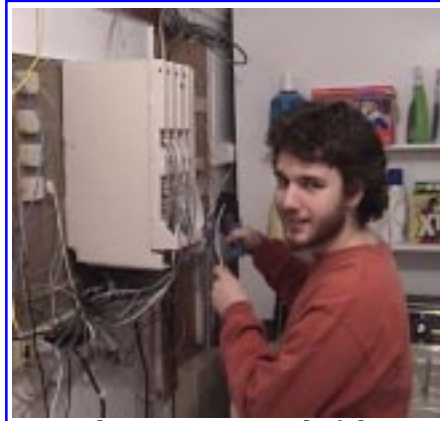
