This month marks a milestone for KICY and Arctic Broadcasting Association. We will celebrate 45 years of broadcast service to western Alaska and the Russian Far East. It is a very exciting time. We recently received this article from a newsletter and have obtained permission to re-print it here.

"Several months ago I was refused a visa to return to Chukotka where we first lived and worked in Russia. The people were very disappointed; they've been waiting seven years for us to return. However, last month the Lord made a way for me to minister to them, and to many other believers in that part of Russia, which is probably larger than the state of Texas. One of the young Russian-Eskimo women that we discipled in Chukotka is now working for a Christian radio station in Nome, Alaska (yes, he is referring to KICY). Her broadcasts are in Russian and are broadcast into a large swath of territory within Chukotka. Luda invited me to do a program with her that was aired into Chukotka and more programs are planned! And I was able to do it from our home in Singapore! I simply telephoned Luda in Nome. She recorded the program and played it back later! Thanks be unto God Who always causes us to triumph! In January, Mary and I did our second radio broadcast from Singapore into the Chukotka Region of Arctic Russia. Larissa, the pastor of the church we established in Provideniya, wrote to us after the broadcast to tell us that the people had gathered in church together to hear the program. Larissa wrote, 'On that day we had service in church and after the service we all listened attentively to the message of our dear Pastor. Everyone who knows you, Mary and the children wept. We even requested the station to rebroadcast the program the following week. Even Vova Vukvan heard the program in Nunligran (another village in Chukotka) and recorded it on audio tape. It was a gift from heaven. The preaching had substance. You always fed us with rich food. Thank you very much. We are looking forward to future messages from you and from Mary also.
