**W**ithin a day of her arrival, Luidmilla (Luda) Kinok was on the air producing her own hour-long Russian language Christian program. I would have been happy with just a half-hour, but Luda had a lot to say!

Now, just a few weeks later and Luda has taken over all of the Russian Language Programming elements. She has her own daily program, prepares the 4-hour discs we receive from CRFR in Moscow, loads Russian weekend programs and has begun recording her former colleague, Larissa Pokhilko in Provideniya for playback on Thursday evening (Friday in Chukotka).

Among her job responsibilities are locating new Russian Christian music for addition to our current

music library and finding new Russian CareForce participants.

She knows she has listeners. Her mother and sister still live in the Chukotkan village of Sereniki where Luda grew up and learned English. She phoned home recently and the entire village was listening to her during the daily broadcasts. That's one way to grow an audience.

Luda came to our attention when Pastor Larissa Pokhilko knew we were looking for a replacement for Andrei and Ellen Sarazov. Luda was working for her in the church in Provideniya. The rest is history.

Join us in praying for Luda and her ability to reach so many with God's Word in Russia.

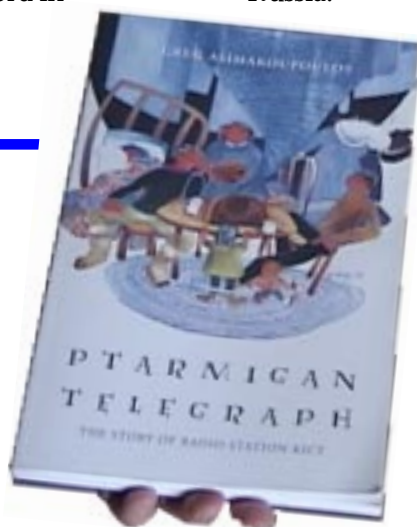

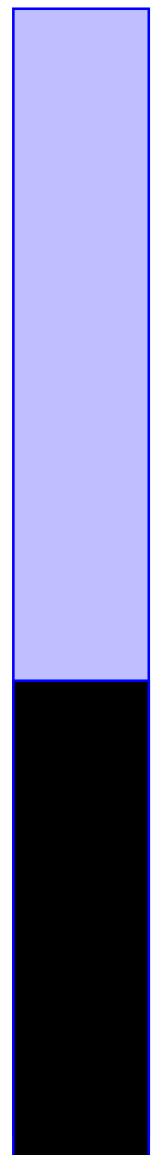
