

We began this unique youth-oriented Christian radio mission nearly seven years ago when Mark Hill approached me about producing this program. Today, it is the only program simulcast on both the AM and the FM stations.

The focus is on the artists and the music which are the leading forces in Contemporary Christian Radio. We work hard to play the top 30 from both the Christian Adult Contemporary and Christian Hit Radio national charts.

We are very fortunate to have the partnership of Anna Larsen and Cathy Lyon overseeing production of The Edge. Both are good friends of Luda Kinok and have joined with her in recording music for the AM side.

Several years ago, Anna had asked

me about helping at KICY, especially the FM, as she is a big fan of Contemporary Christian music. At the time, her work and family schedules didn't allow her to devote the time she needed.

Today, she has encouraged Cathy to join her in dividing the workload so no one feels over burdened by the process of producing a daily radio program.

In addition to TheEdge, there are weather drop-ins and additional voiceover work in hosting our regular programming from 6 PM to midnight. It can be a bit intimidating. So you see, it's a commitment for much more than just the two hours which make up TheEdge five days a week.

Thanks to Anna and Cathy, The Edge continues!


The Annual 100% Sunday Fundraising Event is October 22.

This one-day event has continued to grow and remains our single, largest fund-raising event. I encourage you to





We could still use one, long-term volunteer to staff the office and answer phones from 9 to 5. Keep that need in your prayers, please.




Parting Thoughts.
