We will also make every attempt to plow out the road to the AM Transmitter site if any would like to tour the facilities. A word of warning, however; you may need to hike a few hundred feet if you wish to tour the Phasor Building. Due to the ground system, it isn't possible to plow up to that building and drifts may be well over 7 feet in mid April.


