



The Studio Building Gets A New Sign.

The crowning jewel of the studio residing project which we completed this past summer is a brand new sign.

At the 50th Anniversary Dinner back in April, we honored Ralph and Gert Fondell by naming the KICY studio building, The Fondell Broadcast Center. There is a plaque inside the studio which we shared with everyone at the dinner that night. But we felt we needed to do more. We needed to announce to everyone who passed by that this is now the Fondell Broadcast Center. Lon Swanson used an overhead projector to enlarge the artwork created by the General Manager and traced it onto a 4 foot by 4 foot piece of primed and painted exterior grade plywood. Lon found the paint used to created the 8 foot by 16 foot sign at the transmitter site and went to work.

The installation proved to be the

biggest challenge with two of us on ladders trying to keep everything straight. But, there it is, proudly proclaiming the name of the building.

Besides the new sign, we also have three legal ID's which air at 8 am, Noon and 5 pm, stating "With offices and studios in the Fondell Broadcast Center, this is KICY, Nome." It is complete.
