And still others provide financial support for our vast, daily international broadcast ministry. Thank you.


Each of you has a role. Each is critical to our continued success.

Starbucks (Bold) for Christmas this year. I wish you could see her smile when we unpack the Christmas boxes. Dennis Weidler would






enjoy receiving his perennial favorites, Roasted, Salted Almonds.

At long last, the Triplex is complete and we have signed leases for all the units. Ian and Chris have already moved into Unit 'C'. We thank God every day that this project is behind us.

The transmitter exhibited strange behavior beginning back in early June. After two visits by a factory engineer and many parts repaired or replaced, things are much more stable today. We are at 50,000 watts 24 hours a day with the Carrier Manager reducing our power costs. Just how much we will save remains to be seen.

In all honesty, we felt we were about to wrap things up with major corrections, when it was brought to our attention that the center and east towers were not the best for use in the arctic. So, we are raising \$240,000 to replace the two questionable towers. That includes the two solid steel towers, shipping and a crew to install them. It will take about two weeks in the summer of 2017.
