I imagined beams of light crisscrossing to form a gigantic network of hope, health and healing as strangers prayed for each other from village to village. Yes, I have a vivid imagination. But remember this title of our adversary. In Ephesians 2:2, Satan is called, "the ruler of the kingdom of the air." On the air, KICY is invading Satan's territory. We are part of a


When we serve this station together, we put life itself on the air.

KICY Needs You!



A Quarter Century of Wrestling Play-By-Play

November 2-4, 2017 marked the 36th Annual Bering Strait School District Elementary and Jr. High Wrestling and Cheerleading Tournament, and once again, KICY was there. KICY has been known as Western Alaska's Sports Leader almost since our beginning. It has always been important to us to connect people distances apart through broadcasting community events, and often that means sports. So in about 1992 we started broadcasting the BSSD Wrestling Tournament and Tony Haugen and Sam Towarak were the announcers.

Twenty-five years later, they are still at it. Tony has 30 years as a district employee under his belt,

and Sam retired from the Assistant Superintendent position in 2002, so they know all the players. In fact, they know their parents and grandparents, and the history of wrestling in the

various families. They know the names of the moves, and add local color whenever they can.

My first experience with the sport of wrestling was listening to these men call the tournament, live on KICY, my first fall as a volunteer in 1999. I knew nothing about wrestling, but listening to the broadcast, I couldn't help but be drawn in. Now, I look forward to it each year. Not only do the families of the participants appreciate hearing how their students are faring, it is just plain fun to listen to!

What a blessing to be able to serve our listeners in this way. Congratulations, Tony and Sam, on another fabulous tournament. We already look forward to next year. ■
