The Christian aim is central in KICY's programming. The Eskimo Hour is the most listened to program according to our audience survey. The survey told us also the best time to air the program was during the evening meal. KICY broadcasts within two time zones so the time of five-thirty was agreed upon to allow the maximum number of persons to listen.

Eskimo Hour is recorded in many of the village and local churches. All three main Eskimo dialects and

English are used to convey the Gospel. The half hour consists of songs, testimonies and sharing what God is doing in lives throughout the region. Non-Christians and Christians alike listen to the Eskimo Hour although the main emphasis is on Christian growth and nurture. There are many faithful churches and "New Life" groups recording Eskimo Hour tapes and sending them to KICY to be put out over the air. We encourage more groups to record their singing and testimonies to help KICY share the Good News via KICY radio.
