
together in His perfect timing. As amazingly laudable as their construction work was in this harsh Arctic environment, these humble

It is with great sadness, but with joy and hope in the resurrection, that we share with the KICY family that Ralph Fondell passed peacefully into the arms of Jesus on June 10, 2019, at the age of 95.

In 1958 Ralph and his wife Gert were commissioned as missionaries by the Evangelical Covenant Church to Nome, Alaska, to be part of the beginning and building of KICY. Ralph spent much of 1958 in Nome, building the station and tower along with fellow missionaries. In the summer of 1959 Ralph and Gert moved their young family to Nome, where Ralph served first as Engineer, then Program Manager, and finally General Manager until 1984. Ralph's clear, distinctive voice was well known throughout Western Alaska. As a sign off every night, Ralph referred to KICY as the "Voice of the Arctic," and until his death, his children claimed that as his nickname. That moniker for the station has also remained.

After leaving KICY, Ralph and Gert stayed in Alaska, making Eagle River their home. In the words of Curtis Ivanoff, superintendent of the ECC Alaska Conference, "He was a person who overflowed with the joy of Christ. Ralph has left an indelible mark on the ministry and life of the Alaska Covenant Church and ministries, especially KICY. I am sure his voice echoes in the minds and hearts of many as we thank God for his life."

Ralph was preceded in death by Gert, his wife of 70 years, who passed on February 14, 2019.

A memorial service for both Ralph and Gert will be held at Dawson Covenant Church, in their original home community of Dawson, Minnesota, August 31, 2019.
