

the summer project season began well before the snow had melted from around our towers. As the Tower Team arrived to complete the brace replacement on two towers and install new lights on and paint all three towers, the new braces were still under several feet of snow.

The winter of 2017-18 has gone down in the books as the second snowiest winter in Nome's recorded weather history. It didn't come all at once, we didn't break any snowfall records, but it was constant. We had very few days of sunshine between storms, and the wind was incessant. That wind led to deep drifts, especially out at the Tower site. As late as May 1st the six foot fences

around the towers were nearly covered with snow.

And so it was that on May 16th I went out to the tower site to see about finding the braces. They were located, after a bit, and then our sights were set on accessing the bases of the towers. I am grateful to Dan Hobbs and his sons Tobin and Tristan who volunteered a couple hours that afternoon to help dig us out. In the weeks that followed the tower team was able to complete the projects in spite of there still being significant snow on the ground. It is melting rather quickly now, and all of us in town are eagerly anticipating the eventual arrival of summer.


