The annual Fall Conference was held in October in Anchorage and they had hoped KICY could broadcast the evening services to the western Alaska villages. The Lutheran Church would purchase an airline ticket, provided housing and meals for our staff member.

Stephen Palmatier was available, so off he went to Anchorage with a big tote full of broadcasting and recording gear. We managed to give him a quick tutorial over the phone as he had never used the broadcast equipment before and had minimal experience with the digital recorder. And, there was lots of prayer.

The biggest challenge came when he

arrived in Anchorage. The church had a sound system, but no way to take one feed, let alone two from their system. After an afternoon of running cables and finding microphones, the broadcast began. Stephen also recorded the three day event. But again, with no way to take a feed from a sound system, he had to use the microphones built into the digital recorder. Fortunately, they are excellent mics.

Pastor Karen reported lots of good comments about the live broadcast. And, Stephen was able to add 50 new songs, some in the local Inupiat language, into our Native Singing library for airing on KICY.

We are blessed to be able to serve our listeners.
