watt AM Transmitter has been ordered and is being manufactured to our needed specifications. We have been given a ship date of the middle of April, putting us on track for an early summer install. While the transmitter itself is fully funded, there are other things

that will need to be purchased to facilitate the install. As donations continue to come in, they will be used for the additional equipment that will be needed, things like cables, and a remote monitoring system, as well as any skilled labor we need to hire. Also, a backup 10kW transmitter that is looking more and more like a reality sooner rather than later.

on Swanson has been a presence at KICY for more than a dozen years. Currently, he is the host of The Breakfast Club, the morning show on KICY AM-850, and maintains all AM music libraries. Another of his responsibilities is organizing the pastors who participate in CareForce, making sure each weekday is covered, and filling in when other pastors are not available.

His years at the station have also provided many opportunities for "other duties as assigned," from light maintenance to covering basketball, and from emptying the trash to recording regional village Get Togethers. Lon has also been a consistent presence at the high school as a substitute teacher and as a youth worker at Nome Covenant Church's youth center, Checkpoint. And now, his time at KICY is coming to a close. Lon has decided it is time to move on and will be "retiring" from KICY late this summer.

In addition to the large shoes Lon will leave behind that need filling, it has become even more apparent over the past year that we need an engineer at the radio station here in Nome. While I am blessed by the folks I can call on any time to help with engineering questions, and am grateful for the technology that allows remote technicians to access our equipment, an on-site engineer would allow for routine maintenance, as well as more immediate repairs when needed.

or many years, KICY provided postage paid business reply envelopes as a courtesy to our donors. Over the past year, we have slowly been discontinuing that service. The permit from the post office was costing in excess of \$2,000 per year, in addition to postage for each envelope returned. In an effort to wisely use the funds that are so generously given, we decided not to renew our permit. Beginning in April, we started using courtesy envelopes that do not include postage. When the permit came due in August, we did not renew.

Since we had a postage balance on hand at the post office, they have been gracious to continue processing the business reply envelopes even though we no longer contract with them for that

service. Our request is now this: please discontinue using the postage paid business reply envelopes if you still have any.


