## **Redington Wins Iditarod 51**



he 51st Iditarod began March 5th in Willow with 34 teams taking to the trail. Though the number of participants was down, the excitement was real as both spectators and coverage of the race got back to pre-pandemic levels. Ryan Redington crossed under the burled arch in Nome first, bringing the trophy bearing the image of his grandfather, one of the original organizers of the race, home to the Redington family for the first time.

KICY's coverage was extensive. Aaron Brown and Aaron Cooper spent the better part of a week on the scaffold at the arch on Front Street (in front of the Covenant Church) welcoming in each finisher. They also hosted post-race interviews with several mushers, including the top three. Nate Hobbs provided on the ground support a few miles out of town, reporting on teams as they neared Nome.

The Iditarod hosts a website with GPS tracking of mushers and a live-streamed finish of the winner. Anchorage based TV personnel are in town to cover the first place finisher as well. In the end, old school radio ruled the day as the Iditarod website crashed and there was a glitch in television coverage as Ryan neared the finish line. For a few minutes KICY was the only live coverage of The Last Great Race that had a reach beyond Nome. KICY has covered each Iditarod Nome finish since the very first, and hopes to do so for another 50 years!

n mid February Steve Smit, Terry Reynolds, and Roy Pace came to Nome to install new digital audio boards in both the AM and FM studios. Steve and Nate had put in countless hours leading up to this working on the details and pre-programming as much as possible. Even so the week of the install was filled with a flurry of activity and long

hours.

The week prior, a new VoIP phone system was installed, replacing phones that had served us well for 20 years.

The learning curve was steep at first, but the staff has adapted to the new boards. We also got a crash course in using the phone/audio board interface during live basketball games and Iditarod coverage. While a bit rough at first, it is now routine.

Thanks to a generous donation from the Thomas & Cindy Massie Foundation the upgrades are fully funded.

t is with sadness that we share the passing of former KICY General Manager, John McBride.

John and Sherrie arrived in Nome in 1988 and served for 10 years. In the late 1980s Alaska Airlines instituted "Friendship Flights" between Nome and Provideniya, Chukotka. John took part in two of these flights and as a direct result had the vision to expand KICY's Russian programming from 30 minutes to 90 minutes at the end of each broadcast day (KICY was not a 24 hour station until the early

2000s). It was during his tenure that the process to receive permission to send our signal directional west into Russia overnight was begun.

John also had a passion to reach the lost people in and around Nome, and sought ways to reach the youth of the region with the Gospel through the radio.

We are grateful for John's decade of leadership at KICY and send our sincere condolences to John's wife Sherrie and the entire family.
