An inspector comes to town and goes through a lengthy checklist, as if it were an actual FCC inspection. A passing grade ensures the FCC will not randomly select the station for inspection in the next three years. It is also an opportunity to learn more about the rules and regulations as the inspector is also there as an educator. Once again, KICY AM & FM passed with flying colors.

Coincidentally, this triennial inspection happened in the year our FCC broadcast licenses are up for renewal. Going into this renewal period, it is good to know everything is as it should be.

In other good news, the final paperwork for our Elim translator has been filed and we are operating at full power. KICY AM-850 can now also be heard on 97.3 FM in Elim. We have already had reports of people appreciating the fact that KICY can now be heard in the village itself, rather than just out at the summer fish camps. Praise God for engineers to do the work, good weather for the needed trips to Elim, the partnership with Norton Sound Health Corporation which has allowed our equipment to be housed in the clinic, and the generosity of donors who gave toward this project.

Volunteer Update

This has been a summer of transitions. For several years, Luda Kinok has had a part time job at the Nome Post Office. In July she accepted a transfer to Honolulu. Thanks to the marvels of modern technology, Luda is still able to provide KICY with Russian language programming. We have outfitted her with a home studio that interfaces with our automation system, and we are blessed Luda is



still committed to providing this much needed service for KICY.



In early August, Lon Swanson officially retired from service at KICY. He has moved back to his home state of Illinois and we look forward to hearing how God is using his gifts and talents in that place. He is missed, both by us at the station and the listeners in the KICY audience who tuned in to The Breakfast Club each weekday morning. During Lon's last morning on the show, I took over the microphone and asked listeners to call in to bless Lon.
