t was 20 years ago this past July that I landed in Nome for the Lirst time. Eager anticipation would be good words to describe my feelings that day as the jet touched down under rainy skies. It rained my entire first week in Nome, but that didn't dampen my enthusiasm



for beginning to learn about radio ministry and the people and places KICY served. Frances Whitmore, Mark Hill, Swede Hanson, and

Libby (Carlson) Benson, the current volunteers, were all so helpful and encouraging. And then our new General Manager and his wife arrived. Dennis and Candace Weidler stepped off the plane with a heart to serve, an expertise in broadcasting, and strong leadership for the station. In addition to all of this, two new towers were being erected at the tower site that summer, and the station would soon be boosting its power to 50,000 watts and turning the signal directional west each night to intentionally send the message of the Gospel, in the Russian language, far into the Russian mainland. It was a time of renewed excitement for radio ministry in Western Alaska and the Russian Far East. As we began the new millennium, we also celebrated 40 years of God's faithfulness in

providing for the needs of KICY. Who would have known that 20 years later, I would be at KICY to celebrate the 60th Anniversary? I had no inkling that God's path for my life would lead me back to KICY so many years later, but God knew.

Though it shouldn't, it always amazes me when I look back and see how the hand of God has moved both in my life and the life of KICY. God knows our past, our present, and our future, and He knows the needs we have before we do. He is our sustainer, our provider, our hope, our sufficiency, both in our personal lives and for the station. There have been so many times over the past 60 years, from the station's infancy and the vision of men like Ralph Hanson, Ralph Fondell, Bill Hartman, and Art Zylstra, to the challenges that radio ministry in Western Alaska presents even today, that God has been faithful. For the 50th Anniversary, a short documentary was produced called "50 Years of Miracles." If you have not seen the video, I encourage you to go to our website, kicy.org, (scroll down on the home page to find it) and take a look. We could change the title to "60 Years of Miracles," and still be accurate. This is God's ministry, and we are just stewards of it.

For 60 years, KICY has relied on the

generosity of those who believe in the work we are doing in Western Alaska and the Russian Far East. And God has provided. Through gifts of a few dollars, to bequests in the thousands, by those who commit to support KICY monthly, and those who give once, our needs are supplied. We know our costs will continue to escalate. Electricity is expensive in Western Alaska. Our AM transmitter is nearing the end of its projected lifespan. Some of our staff housing needs refurbishing. Regular maintenance on the equipment requires skilled labor that can be expensive. We would like to be able to get out to villages more often to broadcast Get Togethers and conferences, and support the ministry leaders in those communities, and air travel is pricy. But we serve a God who knows our needs and knows already how those needs will be met.

Please pray about how you can financially support this ministry. If you already give, thank you. If you have given in the past, but haven't for a while, or if you have never given, please pray about how God might use you to help meet our financial needs. God moves in miraculous ways, but most often chooses to work through His people. Thank you for considering a generous end of the year gift to further the ministry of KICY.






