
It shouldn't, but it often surprises me how much God cares about our equipment needs. We were able to upgrade the audio boards in both our studios to a digital system in

February. Digital is the present reality of radio and it was time to take that step. Thanks to a generous donation from the Massie Foundation and the over-the-top donation of time from engineers Steve Smit and Terry Reynolds, the studios have updated equipment, including a phone system that has eliminated static in the lines. Our programs and live feeds are now clearer than ever.

The West Tower base replacement is just one more example of God's abundant provision. Check out the October 2023 Call Letter on our website if you have not yet heard that story. Suffice it to say that God took care of the timing, the equipment, the skilled personnel, and the finances in ways nothing short of miraculous reminding me once again that God definitely wants this radio station to continue broadcasting His Good News for a long time to come. The bases of the other two towers were replaced in 2007, so now all three towers are stable and secure for the foreseeable future.

Thank you for your partnership in this ministry. Thank you for sacrificially giving when the Holy Spirit prompts, whether that is a one time gift or a monthly contribution. While expenses were up this year due to increased fuel costs, giving matched that and we have ended the year in a good place financially. Praise God! 
