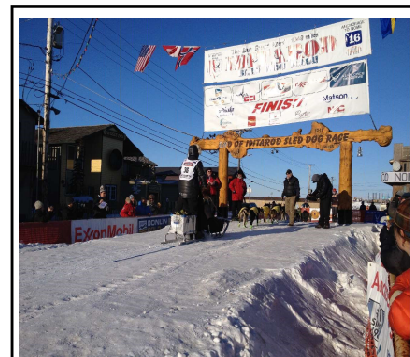
The KICY Studio Building contains two broadcast studios, offices, Genesis Recording and three apartments for volunteers

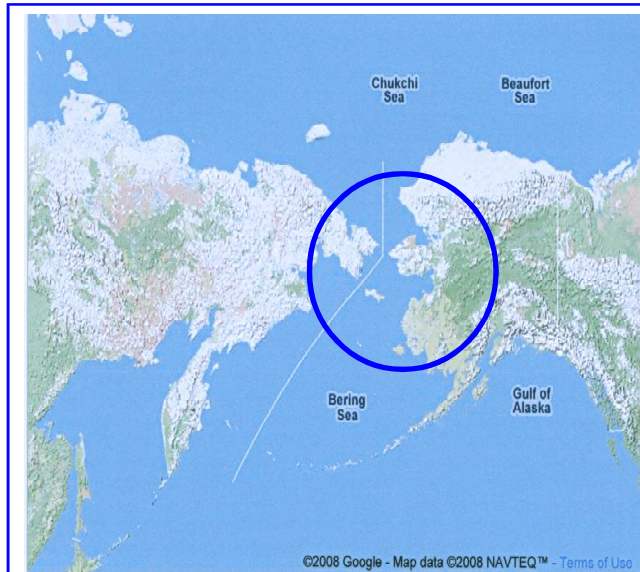

Our Listeners

- Our target audience encompasses several major indigenous people groups: Inupiaq, Central Yup'ik, Cup'ik, and Siberian Yup'ik.
- Many villages in our listening area are without pastors.
- CareForce, a daily prayer request program, is one of our most popular programs.
- Overnight, our signal reaches about 2,000 miles into mainland Russia.
- Radio is often the primary means of connection between villages, especially when people are out at their fish camps in the summer practicing their subsistence lifestyle.

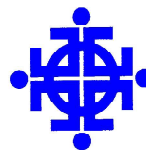


KICY's Coverage Area: Daytime, Non-directional
